

MONTFORT INTEGRAL ECO FARM

NALANDULLAH BRO. MARIANNAN

"CULTIVATING THE LAND, CULTIVATING HOPE"

Dear Friends,

Warm greetings and best wishes from Montfort Integral Eco Farm, Nalandhulla. It gives me great joy to share with you the latest happenings and milestones at our farm.

We are delighted to announce that we have reached the 10,000 mark in planting a diverse variety of fruit trees. The young saplings are thriving beautifully. The months of May, June, July and August are the most challenging for farming in our region, as strong winds sweep through the valley - our farm lies directly in the wind corridor of the Western Ghats, coupled with the scorching heat, this requires intensive irrigation to keep the plants healthy. Thankfully, this year we have sufficient water to meet the need. Typically, rainfall is absent during this period, leaving surrounding lands parched and dry, but our farm remains a lush green oasis. A generous neighbour who operates a 75-acre quarry and channels surplus water into our land, aiding our irrigation efforts.

Our orchard is growing steadily:

- 1,750 lemon trees—healthy and expected to yield within a year.
- 1,400 mango trees—two more seasons before harvest.
- 800 guava trees—already producing, with another 4,500 saplings set to yield in eight months.
- 220 dragon fruit pillars—just beginning to produce, though on a small scale.
- 1,400 coconut saplings—healthy and progressing well.
- 400 gooseberries plants—ready to produce in the coming season.
- 150 jackfruit trees—planted along the lake bund, expected to yield in one or two years.

We are also working on product marketing strategies to ensure a stable and sustainable market, as the local market remains unpredictable.

Alongside fruit cultivation, we also grow seasonal crops such as millet, maize, groundnut and tapioca. These crops are laborintensive and prone to pests, making profits modest, though we have avoided losses. Some of these are cultivated as intercrops.

This year, we cultivated three acres of groundnut, producing a large quantity of fodder for our goats. We are currently rearing 25 healthy goat kids in a newly constructed shed, with plans to expand the herd in the near future.

We have been blessed with visits from several distinguished guests, including Rt. Rev. Justin, Bishop of Jaffna; Rt. Rev. Antonisamy Savarimuthu, Bishop of Palayamkottai and now Archbishop of Madurai and Bros. Thomas Montfort, Jerry, and Mathew Pannathanath. The parish youth from Kalugumalai joined us for a one-day retreat and the Brothers of the Southern Sector held their recollection here.

We remain deeply grateful for the presence of all our visitors, as we believe each one leaves behind a positive imprint that nurtures our growth and well-being.

It is our joy to reach you once again through Sangamam and share the latest happenings from St. James School. We, the Brothers, are delighted to unfold our life experiences, mission and vision for the academic year 2025–2026.

Our community this year consists of four young vibrant Brothers, wholeheartedly dedicating our lives to the welfare of rural children and the simple folk of our village. 

ST. JOHN'S FARM

MANAPPARAI BRO. SELVIN ANTONY

"The ultimate goal of farming is not the growing of crops, but the cultivation and perfection of human beings".

Greetings from Manaparai Farm,

Over the past year, we have planted nearly 1,000 hybrid coconut saplings and we are glad to share that they are growing well, with the aim of ensuring sustainable income for the future.



Last year, we entered into a partnership with Pothigai Clonal Nursery, Tirunelveli, to cultivate casuarina. A formal lease agreement was signed between our society and the company. Under this arrangement, we provide the land and water, while the entire investment is borne by the company. They have fenced the entire 65-acre campus at their own expense. The casuarina trees have now reached a height of 12–14 feet and will be ready for harvesting at the end of three years. The company will also take full responsibility for marketing.



So far, they have invested nearly Rs. 65 lakhs and have installed seven 7-HP submersible pumps for irrigation. The company is owned by an IAS officer from Tamil Nadu, currently serving in Bihar.

Looking ahead, there is immense scope for expanding into allied activities such as fish farming, rearing country chicken, cows and sheep. With proper planning and execution, we are hopeful that within the next two to three years, our farm will achieve self-sufficiency.



Dear Brothers in Christ Jesus,

We bow in thanksgiving to God for His benevolence poured upon our new endeavor in the uncharted land of Sri Lanka. As you are all aware, we have initiated a new mission project in Mullaitivu, approximately 140 km away from our current mission base. For over a year now, we have been actively working on establishing this new venture. As expected, the beginning posed several challenges on various fronts, which required ample time and effort to address before we could properly commence the mission.



One of the most demanding tasks was clearing the land, which proved to be quite time-consuming and labor-intensive. Being a new mission in unfamiliar territory, it required extensive support and cooperation from the local community and religious groups. Thankfully, both the public and the

religious were extremely supportive and collaborative.

We also had to liaise with several civil authorities—Police, Army, and Navy—to obtain necessary approvals, permissions, and recognitions from different departments to initiate our mission work. With God's grace, we have been able to make significant progress. Some of the key milestones include:

Approval and installation of a three-phase EB transformer, and electricity supply has now been provided to the site.



- Water connection has been sanctioned by the Sri Lanka Water Board.
- Telephone connectivity has been established through the Department of Telecommunications.
- The front entrance compound wall has been constructed and the main gate has been installed.



- A security room and EB shed have been built.
- A significant number of trees have been cleared to make way for construction.
- Four bore wells have been dug and we are blessed to have found an abundant supply of potable water.
- The foundation for the Brothers' residence has been laid and construction work is currently underway.





In addition to these achievements, several miscellaneous works are also progressing alongside. We sincerely request your continued prayers and support for the success of this new mission.
